## Hymenoptera Chalcidoidea *Naba Australiensis.*

### **Aphelinus Keatsi.**

Like **fuscipennis** but 6-8 discal cilia under distal submarg. absent; 1 of tarsi 1 and 3, black, in all shorter. Three setae each side meson scutum. Nelson, January, jungle.

### **Aph. ovidii.**

Like **fuscipennis** but robuster, half of tibiae dusky, bristle each corner, 17 scattered setae on scutum (as **keatsi** in other). Moolaba, jungle, Sep. Compared N. American **fuscipennis**.

#### **Philotrypesella.**

**L. huberi.** From **Philotrypesis**—antennae 11-jointed, 1 ring-, 3 club. Aeneous save legs, scape; marg. equal long postmarg., stigmal elongate, over half marg. Hypopygium to apex, yellow distad. Like next otherwise but coxae 1 and 3 naked, femur 1 slender, mandible not known. With next.

#### **Philotrypesis aurea.**

From **angela**: Ovipositor not extruded; golden, 3 marks abdomen more transverse, funicle 1 longer. Femur 1 swollen, coxae 1 and 3 elongate, 2 globular, others with black setae above; first tarsus short, 2-4 transverse; other tarsi elongate. Mandibles 3-dentate. Moreton Bay Figs, Brisbane.

#### **Philotrypesopsis.**

**P. hallami.** As **Philotrypesella** but half smaller, antennae 13-jointed, 2 ring-, 3 club, post-marg. equal stigmal, 2/3 marg. Tarsi 4-jointed, 2-3 quadrate, 1 slender. Honey, wings clear; all abdomen, propodeum, antennae, dorsal thorax, blackish. Funicles and pedicel subquadrate. Like **P. huberi** otherwise but scutellum rather flat, apparently with lateral groove. With **huberi**.
